Akiya Workshop is a program that includes construction, architectural and landscape themes during two complementary workshops:

The first activity will be in **September** in Vandellòs and their surroundings. Taking on practical learning of traditional building stone techniques, to the regeneration of rural obsolete tissues, looking for contemporary alternatives with the intention of activate the territory. Through the construction of an ephemeral pavilion and planning an art performance, the workshop should be a space for sharing ideas and possibilities between international students and local people.

The second activity will take place in **February** 2017 at Yanaka Chou neighborhood in Tokyo. In contrast to isolated abandoned Catalan houses, the workshop in Japan take on the problem of abandoned Akiyas wooden houses built with traditional techniques. Consequently large urban areas are being degraded, so the second workshop is focused on how other ancient architecture can hold new social activities. Reading both tissues and analyzing why them are being abandoned will help us to understand the identities of the different tissues and allow us to elaborate specific projects.

The high interest of the program is reflected in building a thought and projecting the preservation of the identity, expressed through ancient building techniques in complementary scenarios: empty, open and rural space in Vandellòs and full, closed and hiperurban space in Tokyo. "There are things that should be preserved, but are overlooked for their natural existence."
